# **Financial Definitions**

# **Member Organization Fees**

Badge Fee	Each member organization has a badge/pin. Some organizations require a member to purchase a badge and others include it in the initiation fee. Badges may be very simple or jeweled. If a member is purchasing her badge, she determines how much or little she would like to spend.
National Dues:	Fee paid to inter/national organizations per member to support overall sorority operations.
New Member Fee - Local:	A one-time fee paid to the chapter to support the operating expenses and activities of the chapter.
Initiation Fee - National:	A one-time fee paid to the national organization that includes a lifetime subscription to The Angelos, certificate of membership and lifetime membership.
Initiation Fee - Local:	A one-time fee paid prior to initiation to support all new member expenses.

# **Chapter Fees**

Chapter Dues:	These dues fund member activities including programming, recruitment, chapter supplies and chapter operations. This includes events such as our sisterhoods which could range anything from a chapter wide cycling session or a movie night with snacks and bracelet making.
Social Dues:	A quarterly fee for all active members in the chapter to cover the costs of our informal (GADs) and formal social events.
Recruitment Income:	A fall quarter fee for all initiated members in the chapter to help cover the costs of recruitment.
Kappa Delta Foundation:	Required contributions paid to the KD foundation in support of its leadership, educational and philanthropic initiatives.
Panhellenic dues:	These funds are used to support Panhellenic operations. Examples of items that may be included in the Panhellenic budget are educational programming (Hazing, Alcohol and Other Drugs, Interpersonal Violence, etc.), community philanthropy efforts, recruitment, and scholarships

## **Facility Fees**

Facility Fee	A non-refundable one-time fee for new members used to maintain the chapter property and is split over the first two quarters of membership (\$250 in the first quarter and \$250 in the second quarter of membership).	
Live Out Fee:	The entire membership has access to the house and thus the property is subject to a great deal of wear and tear. This fee is used primarily for care and maintenance of the property and furnishings in the common areas of the chapter facility.	
Security Deposit:	A damage deposit paid the first quarter of each year that a member lives in the Chapter House and is refundable when a member graduates or leaves Kappa Delta and the University of Washington if that member is on good-standing in all areas.	

Notes (Optional)
\*Empty Bed Fees - If our chapter fails to fill our minimum capacity there may be a small added charge to a specific quarter's bill to account for the empty beds. This is a circumstantial charge so it is not definite when it will or will not exist.
