Financial Definitions

Member Organization Fees

Badge Fee Gold filled badge included in Initiation fee although jeweled options may be purby member.	
Inter/national Fee:	Includes Fraternity Dues, NPC Dues, Insurance Fee, Technology Fee, and GreekBill Fee.
House Fund Fee:	One-time fee paid as a new member to Chapter House Corporation.
Senior Alumnae Dues:	One-time fee paid as a graduating Senior or as a member granted Undergraduate Alumnae Status.

Chapter Fees

Chapter Dues:	These dues fund member activities including programming, recruitment, chapter supplies and chapter operations. Sisterhood, Philanthropy and Social Events are included in these dues.
Sisterhood:	Included in the chapter dues. Examples have been cookie decorating, Mariner's game and a cycle class.
Philanthropy:	Included in chapter dues. Arrow games is our big fundraiser for the year. It lasts a week and includes flag football, pie a Pi Phi and a Pizza cookie feed.
Social events:	Included in chapter dues. Spring formal every year and then at least one special (fun) event each quarter.
Initiation fee:	Fee paid to finalize initial membership in the organization.
New member fee:	Fee paid to establish membership in the organization.
Panhellenic dues:	These funds are used to support Panhellenic operations. Examples of items that may be included in the Panhellenic budget are educational programming (Hazing, Alcohol and Other Drugs, Interpersonal Violence, etc.), community philanthropy efforts, recruitment, and scholarships.

Facility Fees

Meal Plan:	M-F Breakfast, lunch, dinner. Sat-Sun Brunch. Sunday also includes a light self-serve dinner.
Live Out Fee:	The entire membership has access to the house and thus the property is subject to a great deal of wear and tear. This fee is used primarily for care and maintenance of the property and furnishings in the common areas of the chapter facility.

Notes (Optional)

Insurance (\$28) and NPC Dues (\$4) are paid just Fall quarter. Included in Inter/national Fee above. Fraternity Dues (\$65), GreekBill (\$9) and Technology fees (\$25) are paid just Fall and Spring quarters. These are also included in Inter/national Fee above.

Graduating Seniors pay a one-time fee of \$45 for Alumnae status.

There is a \$35 fee for any late payments.
