Financial Definitions

Member Organization Fees

Badge Fee	Each member organization has a badge/pin. Some organizations require a member to purchase a badge and others include it in the initiation fee. Badges may be very simple or jeweled. If a member is purchasing her badge, she determines how much or little she would like to spend.
Inter/national Fee:	Fee paid to inter/national organization per member to support overall sorority operations. Fees include: National New Member Fee, National Semi-Annual Dues, National Risk Management Fee, National Technology Fee and National Housing Fee.

Chapter Fees

Chapter dues:	These dues fund member activities including programming, recruitment, chapter supplies and chapter operations.
Sisterhood Events:	This is included in our chapter dues.
Philanthropy Events:	This is included in our chapter dues.
Social/Special Events:	This is included in our chapter dues.
Initiation fee:	Fee paid to finalize initial membership in the organization.
New member fee:	Fee paid to establish membership in the organization.
Panhellenic dues:	These funds are used to support Panhellenic operations. Examples of items that may be included in the Panhellenic budget are educational programming (Hazing, Alcohol and Other Drugs, Interpersonal Violence, etc.), community philanthropy efforts, recruitment, and scholarships.

Facility Fees

Meal Plan:	We have a toast bar for breakfast every day. Meals are served at 11am for lunch and 5pm for dinner, all week; and 11am brunch on the weekends.
Live Out Fee:	The entire membership has access to the house and thus the property is subject to a great deal of wear and tear. This fee is used primarily for care and maintenance of the property and furnishings in the common areas of the chapter facility.
Room Hold Fee:	This fee holds your room for the fall quarter. It is paid every spring quarter as a returning live-in member.



House Corporation Fee:	A two-time fee of \$325 paid to the chapter's corporation fund. This fund is used for remodeling or making improvements to the existing chapter facilities. The payment is split into fall and winter quarter bills.
Maintenance fee	This fee is paid every fall to cover costs of routine property repairs and maintenance.
Laundry Fee:	Instead of paying per use, this fee is paid every fall to cover the costs of laundry for the year.
