Member Organization Fees

Badge Fee	Each member organization has a badge/pin. A member purchases her badge, she determines how much or little she would like to spend. This is a non-refundable one-time payment for the right to hold the badge during the member's life.	
Per Capita Fee:	This fee deprays expenses for virtual and in-person chapter and member assistance from National Officers, Leadership Consultants and International Office Staff, as well as educational workshops and programming materials.	
Second Century Funds Fee:	This fee helps to fund leadership events provided by the ZTA Foundation, including Officer Leadership Academy, Emerging Leaders Academy and the biannual ZTA Convention. This fee provides, in compliance with IRS guidelines, funding for breast cancer education and awareness programs, educational programming and leadership development.	
Scholarship Fee:	This fee helps to build the ZTA Foundation Scholarship Fund. This small fee supplements funds provided by donors and chapter fundraising.	
Insurance Fee:	This fee contributes to the cost of ZTA's umbrella liability insurance. The Fraternity's insurance provides coverage and protection for members and volunteers in the event of an incident.	
Technology Fee:	This fee offsets costs of online vendor and ZTA services, including Billhighway, OmegaOne, ZetaBase, and Z-learning.	
House Reserve Fund Fee:	This fee provides resources to the Fraternity Housing Corporation (FHC) for present and future housing needs. It is paid by all members whether their chapter has a facility or not. Members in chapters without a residential facility pay significantly less than those with housing.	

Chapter Fees

Chapter dues:	This fee covers all chapter expenses not outlined below, including major annual events like Bid Day, Family Weekend, sisterhood events, social events, campus activities, and budgets for recruitment, chapter committee and supplies.		
New Member Fee:	This is a one-time fee paid after pledging. This fee covers supplies and activities during each new member's time prior to her initiation and management of the ordering of her ZTA badge.		
Initiation fee:	This is a one-time fee paid by each new member prior to her Initiation into Zeta Tau Alpha. The Initiation Fee funds each member's subscription to our quarterly magazine, Themis, and continued membership services for life.		
Chapter Composite Fee:	This fee pays for the large, framed composite of individual pictures of chapter members as well as a smaller copy for each member.		
Recruitment Week Fee:	This fee helps cover the cost of t-shirts, snacks, activities, etc. used by the chapter during the week of recruitment.		
Crown Cup Fee:	This fee covers the cost of our philanthropy week shirts.		
Panhellenic dues:	These funds are used to support UW Panhellenic operations. Examples of items that may be included in the Panhellenic budget are educational programming, community philanthropy efforts, recruitment, and scholarships		

Notes (Optional)
Because Zeta Tau Alpha is an **unhoused chapter**, our members do not pay a Live Out Fee. Programming is primarily held at UW facilities such as the HUB or at the live-outs of members who volunteer to open their homes for an event.

- Zeta Tau Alpha National Scholarships:
 - ZTA Foundation awarded over \$1 million in scholarships for the 2022-2023 academic year through Founders Grants as well as Achievement, Service, Recognition, and Endowed Scholarships to undergraduate and graduate students.

Zeta Tau Alpha Reduced Dues:

- Available to members who live/travel one hour's distance or more from the campus community, while participating in a college-sponsored program, including but not limited to student teachers, interns, coop students, foreign exchange students, and students studying abroad.
- Members approved for reduced dues are only required to pay the national fees and UW Panhellenic dues for that quarter
 - National Fees include per capita, technology fees, house reserve fund, and insurance (fall), second century fund (fall), or scholarship (spring).
